Prosocial behavior (10 items)

Items

- 1 If there is a quarrel or dispute will try to stop it
- 2 Will invite bystanders to join in a game
- 3 Will try to help someone who has been hurt
- 4 Spontaneously helps to pick up objects which another child has dropped (e.g. pencils, books, etc.)
- 5 Takes the opportunity to praise the work of less able children
- 6 Shows sympathy to someone who has made a mistake
- 7 Offers to help other children who are having difficulty with a task in the classroom
- 8 Helps other children who are feeling sick
- 9 Comforts a child who is crying or upset
- 10 Volunteers to help clear up a mess someone else has made
